4. \$1,365,686 in Sidewalks at No Cost to the City (Could possible receive \$213,008 in additional funding):

In order to improve safety on Cedar Avenue and North Street, and to further develop North Street, consider approving the following sidewalks at no cost to the City, as requested by Mayor Jimmy Rafferty (this is in addition to the \$854,200 sidewalk from the Cedar/North Street Curve east to Pine Street that the Board of Alderpersons approved at a previous meeting):

## Cost Estimate: Project Description:

\$839,763.81 From Cedar/North Street Curve south to Brill Street (Pass Estates)

\$364,437.01 From Pine Street east to Church Street

\$161,485.52 From Church St. east 815 ft to the eastern entrance of All Seasons Landscaping \$1,365,686.34

The source of the grant is the Gulf Regional Planning Organization which requires a 20% City Match. The \$273,137 City Match for the sidewalk grant will be paid out of the 2023 \$750,000 Capital Expenditure Grant (HB603) which has a current balance of \$771,130. The remaining balance in the Capital Expenditure Grant (HB603) of \$487,863 can be used for the following other infrastructure projects in the City: \$279,201 for infrastructure on the Harbor Pavilion and \$218,792 for the City Match on an additional phase of the North Street sidewalk to be obtained in 2026. A-4

- 5. \$800,000 Harbor Pavilion at No Cost to the City:
  - Consider appropriating the sum of \$520,799 from the 2024 Capital Expenditure Grant (SB2468) and \$279,201 from the 2023 Capital Expenditure Grant (HB603) to be used for the construction of a Public Pavillion in the East Harbor Greenspace as requested by Mayor Jimmy Rafferty and authorize advertising to hire an architect or engineer to provide conceptual drawings for the Public Pavillion. Per the suggestion of Alderman Kenny Torgeson, a Public Hearing will be held to get input from the Public on the architect's renderings. In the event that the Pavilion is more expensive than \$800,000, the City could use funds from the 2022 Gulf Coast Restoration Fund (GCRF) which includes a 20% City Match. For example, if the total cost of the Public Pavilion is \$1,000,000, the City would have to pay a \$40,000 City Match on the \$200,000 of GCRF funds. A-5
- 6. Consider awarding a grant of \$500k (HB 2468 Downtown Development Grant) for infrastructure (i.e., water, sewer, retaining wall, sidewalks, stormwater detention, etc) Parcel# 0313G-03-029.000 & 0313G-03-029.004 for Whispering Oaks 2. The project has Planning Commission approval and there is no city match. As requested by Alderman Kimball. A-6
- 7. Consider approving Change Order #1 (Final) and Pay Application #1 (Final) to DNA Underground LLC, for Clarence Avenue and West Railroad Apron Repairs in the amount of \$2,375.00 which is a net decrease to the contract for a final total contract amount of \$2,950.00. The proposed change is necessary or incidental to the completion of the work as originally bid, is commercially reasonable and not made to circumvent the public purchasing laws, and that any increase or decrease in cost is reasonable, as recommended by City Engineer Bob Escher. - 8. Consider approving Change Order #2 to Edgerly Enterprises, LLC for St Paul Village Infrastructure in the amount of \$86,000 which is a net increase to the contract for a final total contract amount of \$861,100. The proposed change is necessary or incidental to the completion of the work as originally bid, is commercially reasonable and not made to circumvent the public purchasing Laws, and that any increase or decrease in cost is reasonable, as recommended by Project Engineer. # Summary of Overpayment, Justification for Rent Abatement/Adjustment at Pass Christian Harbor

## Overpayment Credit (Unrelated to Abatement Request)

Gautier's at the Harbor was overbilled for lease payments during the period 2021–2024. As a result, the business is now receiving a credit on its lease invoice. This correction is separate and unrelated to the current abatement request.

## Purpose and Role of Fixed Seafood Dealers

According to the lease definition, the purpose of the three fixed seafood dealers in Pass Christian Harbor is the loading and unloading of fresh seafood and the sale of seafood products. These dealers contribute significantly to the local economy and municipal revenue. Each of the three businesses pays:

- Annual lease fees
- Taxes Sales, Income and Property
- Insurance
- Local and state licensing fees

#### Abatement Justification

## 2019 - Federal Fisheries Disaster Declaration

NOAA and the U.S. Department of Commerce declared a fisheries disaster due to the opening of the Bonnet Carré Spillway. This caused catastrophic damage to the Mississippi Sound's ecosystem. Effects included:

- Zero oyster seasons from 2019 to 2023
- A minimal oyster season in 2024
- A significant reduction in fresh shrimp availability due to the formation of a large dead zone

## 2020 - COVID-19 Market Disruption

The early stages of COVID-19 initially caused shrimp prices to rise due to restricted seafood imports. However, once imports resumed, foreign shrimp and fish flooded the market at below-market prices, driving down prices and destabilizing the domestic seafood industry. Due to high fuel costs and unfair international competition, many local fishermen:

- - Stopped fishing altogether
- · Or began bypassing docks and dealers by selling directly to end users

## Request for Rent Adjustment

The long-term loss of seafood landings—especially oysters—and reduced dealer activity have significantly impacted revenues for fixed seafood dealers in the harbor. Additionally, commercial real estate appraisals show lower values for waterfront properties with this business profile.

Lessee understands and agrees that the leased area is over the Public Tidelands of the State of Mississippi and as such, the City cannot warrant title and can only grant the Lessee such rights and interests as it shall have or is vested in the leased premises under various State Statutes or common law court decisions and/or arising under its aforementioned Tidelands Lease with the State of Mississippi by and through its Secretary of State. Lessor covenants and agrees to comply with the terms of the Tideland's Lease; Lessee's obligations under this Restated Lease Agreement are contingent upon the same.

Purpose; Rent Abatement; Use of Adjacent Premises. It is understood and agreed that 2. the purpose of this lease is for Lessee to engage in the business of loading and unloading seafood and ice to vessels and trucks (the "Business") and for retail sales. Subject to the following provisions of this Section, Lessee agrees to use the leased premised for said purpose for a period of not less than six (6) consecutive months each year and if the Lessee fail to use the premises as specified, except by reasons outside of its control, this lease may be cancelled at the option of the City, but only if Lessee fails to use the leased premises for said purpose within 30 days of notice from the City that it has failed to meet its obligations set forth in this Section and fails to meet such obligation within the six consecutive months following such notice. Non-use of the facility for such purpose shall be disregarded during (i) holidays, (ii) weekends and (iii) periods when the weather or other circumstances outside of the control of Lessee (e.g., oil spills, damage to the leased facilities) (a) substantially stop the commercial harvesting of seafood in areas typically serviced by the facility or (b) prevent the use of the leased facilities for its intended purpose.

Notwithstanding anything in this Restated Lease Agreement to the contrary, no rent shall be due hereunder during any Abatement Period. For this purpose, an "Abatement Period" shall mean any period of greater than 10 consecutive days during which (i) the facility is not used for the Business and during which the commercial harvesting of seafood in areas typically serviced by the facility is substantially stopped due to the weather or other circumstances outside the control of Lessee (e.g., oil spills, hurricanes, damage to the leased facilities) (ii) Lessee ceases to operate the Business due to circumstances beyond its control (e.g., damage to the leased premises or to the routes of ingress and egress), which cessation is commercially reasonable.

Lessor understands and agrees that customers of Lessee will need space to temporarily dock there vessels while waiting their turn to be serviced by Lessee. Accordingly, Lessor agrees that its Harbormaster shall allow Lessee to temporarily use not less than two boat slips on the end of Commercial Pier C6 (not constituting part of the leased premises) for these purposes, or, alternatively, Lessor's Harbormaster shall provide dock space where not less than four vessels can raft while waiting service. In either event, there shall be no additional charge to Lessee for this temporary use of the slips or dock space.

3. Old Fuel Dock. The parties agree that the Lessee will continue to occupy and use the Old Fuel Dock and certain adjacent premises (as identified on Exhibit A attached hereto under and subject to the terms of the Prior Lease Agreement, but with a rental rate

- 3.11 (a) The LESSOR shall have the right to an accounting and audit of the records relating the all rents, fees, revenues, compensation and other income derived from the operations of this LEASE or any or subleases of this LEASE. Notice of said accounting and audit shall be made in writing with five (5) days business notice to the LESSEE at the address provided in this LEASE. The LESSOR shall designate the persons or agencies who shall conduct the accounting or audit.
- (b) LESSEE and sublessees shall make available to LESSOR all required documents and information required by its auditors.

## 4. RENT ADJUSTMENT.

- 4.1 In all instances where rent shall be due under this LEASE or any sublease, LESSOR shall, at the end of each five (5) year period of the primary term of this LEASE, determine the annual rent for the following five year period in accordance with Miss. Code Ann. §29-1-107(2) (1972) as amended, or such other applicable statute as may then be in effect. For all subleases, the LESSEE as sublessor, subject to the approval of LESSOR, shall perform the duties prescribed by this Paragraph for the LESSOR.
- 4.2 The adjusted annual rent shall be the greater of the amount determined by the appraisal or as adjusted by the CPI. However, in no event, shall the adjusted annual rent for any five (5) year period of the lease term be less than the amount fixed as the annual rent effective at the beginning of the lease term
- 4.3 If LESSOR determines that the rent for the ensuing five (5) year period should be fixed by adjusting the current rent by the increase in the All Urban Consumer Price Index—all items ("CPI"), then LESSOR shall calculate the amount of the rent adjusted by the CPI and notify LESSEE, and the rent for the ensuing five (5) year period shall be fixed as adjusted by the CPI. Said rental amount shall be calculated by multiplying the last effective annual rent in the final year of the preceding five (5) year period by a fraction, having as its numerator the monthly CPI index number for the first calendar month of the five (5) year period during which the adjustment is to take effect, and as its denominator the monthly CPI index number for the first calendar month of the preceding five (5) year period.
- 4.4 If not adjusted by the CPI, LESSOR shall review and adjust rent by obtaining an appraisal of the fair market rent for LEASE PREMISES from an appraiser of its own choosing and shall furnish LESSEE with a copy of the appraisal. LESSEE may accept the adjusted rent in LESSOR'S appraisal, and the rent for the ensuing five (5) year period shall be fixed at the amount stated in LESSOR'S appraisal.
- (a) If LESSEE provides written notice to LESSOR within thirty (30) days after receipt of LESSOR'S appraisal that LESSEE does not agree with the rent determined by LESSOR'S appraiser, LESSEE shall have the right to select an appraiser to conduct a second appraisal of the fair market rent for LEASE PREMISES. Such notice by LESSEE shall not be effective unless the notice contains the name of LESSEE'S appraiser and evidence of a commitment by said appraiser to complete LESSEE'S appraisal within sixty (60) days from the date of LESSEE'S notice to LESSOR. LESSEE'S appraisal shall be completed and a copy

promptly furnished to LESSOR'S appraiser within sixty (60) days after LESSEE provides the foregoing written notice to LESSOR. LESSOR'S appraiser and LESSEE's appraiser shall make a good faith effort to resolve any differences in their respective appraisals and, by mutual agreement, fix the annual rent for this LEASE for the ensuing five (5) year period.

- (b) If LESSOR'S appraiser and LESSEE'S appraiser cannot agree on the appraised fair market rent for LEASE PREMISES within thirty (30) days after the completion of LESSEE'S appraisal, LESSOR'S appraiser and LESSEE'S appraiser shall select a third appraiser. The third appraiser shall conduct and prepare an independent appraisal of the fair market rent for LEASE PREMISES. The third appraisal of LEASE PREMISES shall be completed and a copy thereof promptly furnished to LESSOR'S and LESSEE'S appraisers within sixty (60) days after the third appraiser is selected. The appraised fair market rent determined by the agreement of any two of the three appraisers within thirty (30) days after completion of the third appraisal shall constitute the rent for the ensuing five (5) year period.
- (c) In the event that (i) LESSEE fails to give the proper notice to LESSOR within thirty (30) days after receipt of LESSOR'S appraisal that LESSEE does not agree with the fair market rent determined by LESSOR'S appraiser, or (ii) LESSEE'S appraiser fails to complete his appraisal and furnish a copy to LESSOR'S appraiser within the time allowed, or (iii) the third appraiser fails to complete his/her appraisal and furnish copies to LESSOR'S and LESSEE'S appraisers within the time allowed, or (iv) two of the three appraisers fail to agree on the fair market rent within the time allowed, then the annual rent for the ensuing five (5) year period shall be automatically and finally fixed at the amount set in the appraisal prepared by LESSOR'S appraiser.
- 4.5 LESSOR and LESSEE each agree to cooperate and use good faith and diligent efforts to complete the foregoing appraisal procedure at the beginning of the five (5) year period for which the adjusted rent is being determined. If for any reason the rent adjustment procedure by appraisal as set forth in Paragraphs 4.4(a)-(c) is not completed prior to the beginning of the ensuing five year period, LESSOR and LESSEE agree that the interim annual rent pending completion of the appraisal procedure shall be equal to the last effective annual rent for the final LEASE YEAR of the preceding five (5) year period as adjusted by the All Urban Consumer Price Index—all items in the manner provided in Paragraph 4.3. If the fair market rent finally fixed by the appraisal procedure is in excess of the interim annual rent, LESSEE shall pay to LESSOR such excess within thirty (30) days after the appraisal procedure is completed.
- 4.6 LESSOR and LESSEE acknowledge and agree that any appraisal made for the purpose of determining fair market rent for LEASE PREMISES will deduct the value of any improvements owned by LESSEE which substantially enhance the value of LEASE PREMISES.
- 4.7 Any appraiser employed for purposes of review and adjustment of rent under this LEASE shall be at minimum, State Certified General Real Estate Appraiser, shall be disinterested and shall have no personal interest or bias with respect to LESSOR or to LESSEE or with respect to any of the other selected appraisers. Any such appraiser shall act independently and shall not be compensated on any basis that is contingent on a particular result or outcome or on any action or event resulting from any analysis, opinions or conclusions

contained in such appraiser's appraisal. Any such appraiser shall act in good faith and in accord with the highest professional standards, and shall endeavor to accurately and fairly determine the true fair market rent for LEASE PREMISES without favor or bias toward the interests of either LESSOR or LESSEE.

- 4.8 LESSEE and any sublessee agree to furnish financial and income data pertaining to the marina to any appraiser employed to perform appraisals pursuant to the terms and provisions of this LEASE. Information will be furnished for the periods requested by said appraiser.
- 4.9 In the event LESSOR and LESSEE or any sublessor cannot agree on an adjusted rental amount, the LEASE may be canceled at the option of LESSOR.

5.1 LESSEE covenants and agrees to pay, or require any sublessee to pay, any and all assessed general taxes and special assessments, if ever any there be, applicable to the above described property and LESSEE'S interest therein and improvements thereon; further, LESSEE covenants and agrees to pay any and all survey costs and recording fees in connection with this LEASE or any other fees directly incurred by the LESSOR in administering or enforcing this LEASE or so determined by applicable law.

#### 6. TRANSFERABILITY OF LEASE.

- 6.1 LESSEE shall not sublease or otherwise transfer its rights or obligations under this LEASE without prior approval of LESSOR and as provided in this Paragraph.

- 6.3 LESSEE may sublease areas within LEASE PREMISES for DEVELOPMENT USE.
- 6.4 All subleases shall be subject to the terms of this LEASE shall be submitted to the Secretary of State for approval and shall not be valid or effective prior to or without the written approval of the Secretary of State. No sublease will be approved unless the sublessee has demonstrated to the Secretary of State that the proposed development is economically viable and sustainable and also promotes the public use of the Public Trust Tidelands, which determination and approval shall be at the sole discretion of the Secretary of State. North Street Gravity Sewer Improvements – Phase II & III

Ladies and Gentlemen:

This change order is due for the costs to replace the existing force main from the pump station 28 to the manhole at the intersection of North Street and Mercier Avenue.

It was not discovered until the last 30 days that the existing force main is transite pipe and is located above the existing sewer line that is being replaced through this project. Due to the proximity of the force main to the gravity sewer main and inherent brittle nature of the transite pipe, there is concern that the main would be damaged during construction. Replacing the force main through this change order will prevent accidental breakage and having a heavily repaired force main with future maintenance implications.

Additionally, the increased costs due to this change order will be completely covered by the surplus funding from Phase I of this project.

Therefore, this change order serves to increase the contract price by \$125,053.60 to cover the costs for the force main replacement and also adds 45 days of contract time to account for the time to complete the additional work.

For the aforementioned reasons provided, we recommend the City approve the change order to ensure uninterrupted progress on this project. For any questions or additional information, please contact us.

Mr. Jones,

Please see the attached Summary Change Order for the referenced project for the City's review and approval. The work has been substantially completed and is nearly ready for the City's final acceptance. The final closeout package including a final pay application is anticipated to be submitted soon.

The proposed change order constitutes the field measured "final quantities" of work satisfactorily performed by the Contractor, along with a contract time extension for the unavoidable delays encountered during the project, including the crossing of Market St. and the significant coordination with Gulf Coast Prestress that was done to minimize disruption to their services. As noted in the change order, the savings over the estimated budget for the project proved to be just over \$215,000. In short, we recommend this change order for City approval.

Additionally, this letter is also to request an amendment to the fee for engineering services as provided by Overstreet & Assoc. for this project. Per the above, the change order does provide for an adjustment in contract time of just under 74%. Since our construction engineering & inspection services generally coincide with the Contractor's time for performance, we expended more than our contract amount and have in good faith continued to perform the contractual services well beyond our anticipated period of performance. For the City's benefit, we have actually worked on this project since October 2024 with no invoices because our contractual fee amounts had been expended. Therefore, we believe that an adjustment to our fees for the referenced phases is appropriate and deserved, and we hereby request your consideration in this matter, especially in light of the significant savings against the project budget as detailed in the construction Summary Change Order. Our requested fee adjustment amounts is as follows, with the percent increase for each phase shown in bold:

Construction Administration Inspection

\$10,750 (~20% increase) \$57,700 (~49% increase)

Gates that provide access to swimming pools must be self-closing and equipped with a self-latching locking device, the release mechanism of which must be located on the pool side of the gate and so placed that it cannot be reached by a young child over the top or through any opening or gap. All gates located within six (6) feet of the pool's edge must open outward from the pool.
- f. A barrier may not be located in a way that allows any permanent structure, equipment, or similar object to be used for climbing the barrier.

- Required Screening A fence or wall provided to meet Screening standards shall in no case exceed a height of eight (8) feet.
- b. Recreational Fencing Customary fencing provided as a part of a permitted tennis court, athletic field, or other recreational facility shall be exempt from the height restrictions of this subsection.
- c. Public Safety Use Fences and Walls Major utilities, wireless communication towers, government facilities, and other public safety uses shall be allowed to increase maximum fence or wall heights to ten feet in front, side, and rear yards, unless further increased through an approved security plan.
- d. Security Plan Fences and Walls An owner or tenant or a representative of a public agency responsible for a public facility may submit to the Planning Department a site security plan proposing fences or walls taller than those permitted by this section, or the use of barbed or concerting wire atop a fence or wall. The Planning Department shall approve or approve with conditions the site security plan and its proposed exemption of fences or walls from the standards of this subsection, on finding that:

The hours worked shall be excluded by the employer in the calculation of the hours for which the substituting employee would otherwise be entitled to overtime compensation under the Act. - (b) The provisions of section 7(p)(3) apply only if employees' decisions to substitute for one another are made freely and without coercion, direct or implied. An employer may suggest that an employee substitute or "trade time" with another employee working in the same capacity during regularly scheduled hours, but each employee must be free to refuse to perform such work without sanction and without being required to explain or justify the decision. An employee's decision to substitute will be considered to have been made at his/her sole option when it has been made (i) without fear of reprisal or promise of reward by the employer, and (ii) exclusively for the employee's own convenience.
- (c) A public agency which employs individuals who substitute or "trade time" under this subsection is not required to keep a record of the hours of the substitute work.
- (d) In order to qualify under section 7(p)(3), an agreement between individuals employed by a public agency to substitute for one another at their own option must be approved by the agency. This requires that the agency be aware of the arrangement prior to the work being done, i.e., the employer must know what work is being done, by whom it is being done, and where and when it is being done. Approval is manifest when the employer is aware of the substitution and indicates approval in whatever manner is customary.

Subject: Shift Substitution Policy Initiated

**PURPOSE** 

To establish a policy governing voluntary shift substitutions in accordance with 29 CFR § 553.31, ensuring consistency, fairness, and compliance with training and staffing standards.

#### SCOPE

All fire This SOP applies to all full-time firefighters of the Pass Christian Fire Department scheduled on a rotating shift, including 48/96 hour schedules.

#### **POLICY**

The department permits voluntary shift substitutions when done for personal convenience and not at the employer's request. Substitutions must comply with Fair Labor Standards Act provisions and this SOP.

#### 1. Eligibility Criteria

- 1.1.1. Only employees who are current on all required training hours and annual training mandates are eligible to request or perform shift substitutions.
- 1.1.2. No firefighter may substitute more than **15 shifts** per **calendar year** (based on a standard 60-shift annual schedule).

#### 2. Request Process

- 2.1.1. All shift swaps must be submitted in writing (via approved form)
- 2.1.2. Both parties involved must sign the request.
- 2.1.3. Final approval must be granted by a Chief Officer before the swap is valid.

#### 3. Approval Criteria

- 3.1.1. The Chief Officer will ensure:
- 3.1.2. Both parties are current on mandatory training.
- 3.1.3. The substitution does not exceed the 15-shift limit.

3.1.4. The swap does not disrupt minimum staffing or operational readiness.

#### 4. Training Compliance

- 4.1.1. Firefighters who fall behind on annual or required training will be ineligible to participate in substitutions until fully compliant.
- 4.1.2. Training status will be verified prior to each substitution approval.

#### 5. Responsibility for Shift

- 5.1.1. Once approved, the firefighter accepting the shift assumes full responsibility for reporting and completing that duty.
- 5.1.2. Failure to report will result in disciplinary review under the department's attendance policy.

#### 6. Recordkeeping

6.1.1. All approved substitutions will be recorded and tracked by administrative staff to monitor annual limits and compliance.

#### **ENFORCEMENT**

Violation of this SOP, including exceeding the wap limit, unauthorized swaps, or participating while non-compliant with training, may result in disciplinary action in accordance with departmental policy.

#### <u>Purpose</u>

To delineate the County's policy concerning exchanging work time between employees to provide a more cost-effective solution of a full-time firefighter's need to take leave at a specified time.

#### Scope

This policy applies to all Fire Department shift personnel working at a station.

#### **Policy**

A "Shift-substitution" is defined as, by mutual agreement, an employee voluntarily working part or all of another employee's scheduled shift.

A "*Trade-time*" is defined as, by mutual agreement, two employees **voluntarily** working each other's scheduled work hours. (Firefighter "A" works Firefighter "B's" scheduled shift. Firefighter "B" then works Firefighter "A's" shift in return).

<u>Note:</u> A "Trade-time" is essentially two Shift Substitutions, while a "Shift-substitution" is not a Trade-time".

Firefighters are authorized 2 Shift Substitutions/Trade-time per calendar month, with additional substitutions as authorized by their Battalion Chiefs/Deputy Chief.

The employee's immediate supervisor must approve Shift-substitution/trade-time before substitutions or trading time/shifts.

The County does not assume any responsibility for compensating an employee who voluntarily agrees to work for another. The extra hours worked by an employee during shift-substitution/trade-time shall not be used to determine payments for overtime or any other benefit.

An employee may only swap-substitution/trade-time with another employee of equal employment status and capabilities.

Once a shift-substitution/trade-time has been approved, the employee who agrees to work another employee's shift/time is responsible for working the agreed upon a tour of duty.

The employee initially scheduled to work is completely relieved of duty and shall receive full compensations as though he/she had worked his/her tour of duty.

Any employee who agrees to work another employee's shift/time and who fails to report to duty at the appropriate time shall be subject to disciplinary action, including but not limited to being considered absent without leave. Legitimate absence will be charged to the appropriate category of leave.

#### 1. PURPOSE

The Gulfport Fire Department provides that two individuals may agree, solely at their option and with the approval of their Shift/District Commander, substitute ["Trade Time"] for one another during scheduled work hours in the performance of work in the same capacity.

#### 2. POLICY

- A. The employee requesting time off as "Trade Time" shall be responsible for properly making the request in the current RMS. Request shall be entered no later than 1700hrs the shift prior to the date to be traded. Employees shall also notify their immediate Supervisor.
- B. Prior to agreeing to trade time, an employee shall verify that no conflict of training, classes, presentations, assigned draft day or any other pre-scheduled events will prevent them from fulfilling their obligations.
- C. Once an employee has agreed to trade time it becomes the sole responsibility of the replacing employee to report for duty at the correct time.
- D. Personnel are allowed 2 time trades per calendar month. Employees requesting/needing more than 2 will need approval of their Shift/District Commander
  - 1) Firefighter Recruits *may* be allowed a maximum of 4 time trades during their probationary period. Approval will be at the discretion of the Shift Commander only. Approvals will be based on evaluations, performance and current progress within the "Continuity Packet".

#### Springville City full-time Firefighter Shift Trade Policy

Administration

#### Purpose:

To provide direction and authorization of the "Shift Trade" policy governing the ability for authorized employees (Springville City full-time Firefighters) to trade shifts with "same classification" full-time firefighters in accordance with FLSA 553.31 Substitution – section 7(p)(3). Shift Trades are a privilege and may be suspended or revoked if department procedures are violated. Probationary firefighters can start exchanging shifts after six (6) months of employment, or after finishing their training packets and are satisfactorily working in an operations assignment.

This policy establishes the procedures relating to Shift Trades and the maximum number of consecutive 24-hour shifts an employee can work for Springville City Fire Department in conjunction with FLSA 553.31 Substitution - section 7(p)(3) and the Department of Labor (DOL).

#### **Policy Guidelines**

This policy is under the guidelines provided by FLSA 553.31 Substitution - section 7(p)(3).

Springville City Full-time Firefighters (employees) within the same classification may be granted the opportunity to exchange shifts (Captains for Captains, Engineer for Engineer, EMT for like EMT, etc.). Employees must exchange shifts with an employee of the same classification or with an employee who can act in that capacity. Shift exchanges shall not qualify an employee for overtime payment and cannot be repaid in any other form of compensation.

Shift Trades are an agreement strictly between two employees within the same classification approved by the Fire Chief or authorized designee. No other parties are involved. Springville City shall not be held liable nor will not compensate under any circumstance for employees who arrange for shift trades and are unable to receive like shift trade in return.

SPRINGVILLE FIREFIGHTER/EMT POLICIES AND EXCEPTIONS TO POLICIES FOUND IN THE SPRINGVILLE CITY PERSONNEL HANDBOOK - Full Time Firefighter Shift Trade Policy - Effective 10-26-2022 Springville City Policy and Procedures Page. 1 of 3

Springville full-time firefighters shall not work more than three (3) consecutive 24-hour shifts, with or without partial leave. In instances where three (3) consecutive shifts are worked, members must be off- duty a full 12 hours before working again, with exceptions due to unusual circumstances such as natural and manmade disasters, etc.

Partial shift trades are subject to the same guidelines as a full 24-hour shift trade without exception.

It is the employee's responsibility to schedule their extra work time, so that this policy is not violated, and the employee is available and eligible to work their regularly assigned shift in addition to any shift trade they accepted.

Any employee who is found to be in violation of this policy will be relieved from duty and replaced by the Captain on duty, and will no longer be able to participate in shift trading.

#### Caution

Fatigue caused by extended periods of inadequate rest may impair job performance in such critical areas as tactical size-up, deployment of companies, BLS/ALS skills and defensive driving techniques. In addition, and most importantly, the ongoing and deliberate efforts in the area of safety consciousness may be adversely affected.

If the above conditions appear to be an issue, fire department administration and/or supervisors will address the circumstances and implement appropriate fatigue management procedures whenever feasible.

#### **Procedure**

When a "trade" is mutually agreed upon, it is the responsibility of the employee providing coverage to ensure that the "Aladtech" entry is properly completed prior to 10 PM the day prior to the trade occurring. Employees that enter into a "trade" after the 10 PM time frame must communicate with the Captain on duty between 0530 and 0630 hours the day of the shift informing them of the late shift trade entry.

It is the responsibility of the Shift Captain to approve or disapprove shift trade requests in "Aladtech" no later than the shift prior to the "trade" occurring whenever possible. The Duty Captain will remove the "requesting employee" from "Aladtech" and ensure the "trade" employee providing coverage is reflected as on duty in "Aladtech", and ensure the "OFF" employee is clocked in for the duration of the trade in "TimeForce" (so that pay and compensable hours worked are not affected).

If the employee providing relief cannot cover the "trade", responsibility for the shift returns to the employee requesting relief, and the corresponding hours will be subtracted from their PTO annual leave pool.

It is the employee's responsibility to insure "trade" repays all "trade" within a 12-month period. It is also the employee's responsibility to ensure that their shift trades do not conflict with the maximum consecutive work shift procedure (72 hours). Shift Trades shall not qualify an employee for premium overtime payment and cannot be repaid in any other form of compensation. Employees who are working out of class must exchange shifts with an employee of the same classification who also has the capability of working out of class.

The Fire Chief or authorized designee must approve ALL "trades".
